My research broadly examines the causes the causes and consequences of social and economic inequalities in the United States and other affluent nations. My scholarship explores how major changes in the economy, such as the financialization and globalization, has impacted income inequality and the quality of life for workers. My research on the effects of immigration on small towns and large cities, as well as my work on the causes of white-Latino segregation, explores how demographic, social, and political-economic factors shape the communities where we live. While the main goal of my research is to contribute to theoretical and methodological debates in the academy on the causes and consequences of inequality, my research also has policy-relevant implications. I have several contributions to note:

- I have recent work funded by the National Science Foundation related to developing a middle school youth advocacy program around disaster resilience in Savannah, which focuses on helping marginalized communities prepare for and respond to natural disasters like flooding and hurricanes.
